2024 YEAR END MATCHING FUND DRIVE IS ON – Everything that you donate will be matched. This year's goal is to raise a total of \$60,000 towards these 4 projects:

• Tote bags. The children will color the bags with our 2025 theme, "Jesus, the Source of Living Water". They will be filled with rice, beans, tuna, pasta and treats, helping the families of the children-\$15,000





• Bibles. Spanish Children's Bibles will go in each child's bag-\$3,000



- Purchase of more cows and other improvements for the farm. Children love the farm experience, seeing the cows and even milking them with Miguel-\$10,000
- New Side by Side Electric Vehicle Our old vehicle needs replacement. It serves the farm, carrying milk from the corral to where it is made into cheese, plus it is used for a whole host of other

activities. \$32,000 (not all of the cost, but a large portion)



How your match money from last year has been used:

1. The Farmer John Education Building will soon be built. We have the plans from the architect and once we have approval, construction will begin, with your wonderful support. More cows were added to the herd and more will be added in 2025.



- 2. As part of our addition to the amphitheater, we continue to use your funds to buy more props for the dramas. The dramas are, hands down, one of the children's favorite events
- 3. Many maintenance updates have been completed, including electrical rewiring. Roy, Paul and Thelma's son, has painted the staff dorms, completing the total renovation project of the staff house with the earlier help in June of mission teams from Elk River. These rooms are looking great.

Campers will be with us from 8 different Costa Rican neighborhoods, 5 groups are from Puntarenas area, and 1 group each is coming from Palmares, Puerto Viejo and San Jose. Three of these 8 ministries are new to the Camp, so Praise to the Lord for welcoming new groups.
